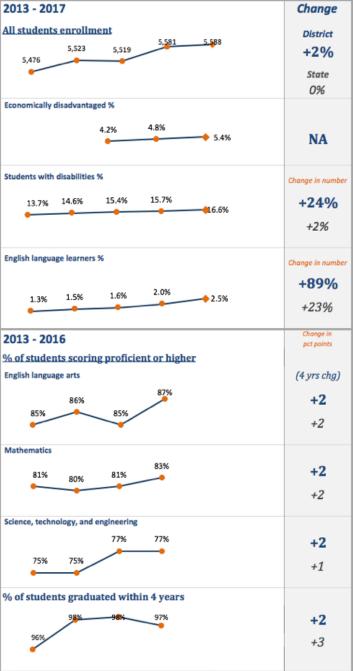


### **Selected Indicators – Student Demographics**

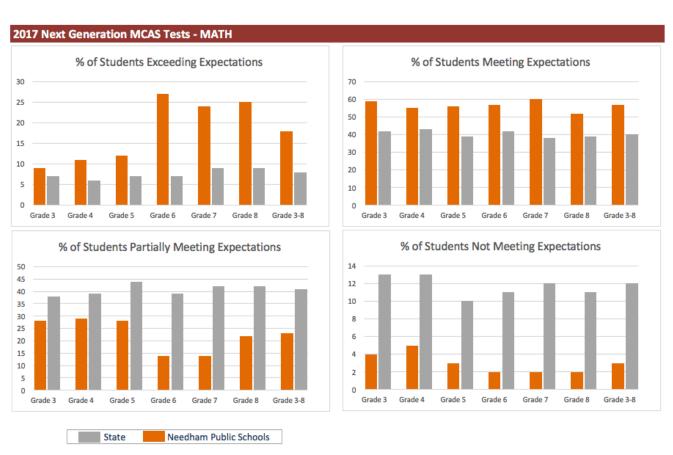
