THE SCHOOL NURSE PROVIDES THE FOLLOWING HEALTH SERVICES

- Individualized health care planning and case management for students with special health care needs
- Health and wellness promotion
- Illness and injury prevention, assessment, and intervention
- Medication administration and nursing procedures
- Communicable disease prevention and control
- Mandated health screenings:
- Hearing and vision
- Postural
- Height, Weight and BMI
- Access to health care services and insurance

Environmental health and safety

- Management of confidential student health records
- Emergency preparedness and medical response
- Communication and collaboration with students, parents/guardians, the school faculty/staff, and community health care providers

PLEASE CONTACT THE SCHOOL NURSE WHEN:

- There's a new medical diagnosis or change in your child's physical, behavioral, or emotional health status including:
- A new allergy
- A newly prescribed medication or a change in dose of a current medication
- A serious injury, illness, condition requiring emergency treatment, hospitalization, or surgery
- A head injury or concussion
- An injury requiring sutures, casting, splints, or mobility assistance of crutches or wheelchair
- Contagious conditions such as, chicken pox, flu, strep throat, whooping cough, pneumonia, conjunctivitis, or head lice
- Your child is absent for >3 days due to physical illness, injury, or mental health condition
- There's a transitional change in your family or traumatic event that may affect your child

YOUR CHILD MUST STAY HOME FROM SCHOOL WITH:

- Diagnosis of a communicable disease
- Fever greater than 100°F within the last 24 hours and without medication
- Vomiting/diarrhea within the last 24 hours; students should be able to consume and tolerate their "typical" diet before returning to school
- Acute pain that requires relief by narcotic medications
- An upper respiratory illness with persistent coughing and/or unmanageable nasal discharge
- An undiagnosed rash

MEDICATION POLICY

The Needham Public Schools Medication Policy complies with the regulations of the Massachusetts Department of Public Health

- Health Services requests that medication be administered by a parent/guardian before and after school hours, if possible.
- The school nurse is responsible for medication administered to students.
- All medications, prescriptions and over-thecounter medications, require documentation of an order by a licensed prescriber and consent by parent/guardian
- ALL Medications must be delivered by the parent/guardian or designated adult, to the School Nurse in a pharmacy or manufacture's labeled medication container
- Medications are not accepted in pill boxes, envelopes, or plastic bags
- Students are not permitted to bring medication to school except for those medications that they are approved to carry and self administer.
- New medication orders are required at the start of each school year.
- All medication orders expire at the end of each school year and medications must be picked up by a parent/guardian by time of dismissal at the close of the school year.
- All medications that are not picked up by dismissal at the end of school year will be destroyed.
