
When do you see yourself as an empowered learner at Broadmeadow?

Re: ACCEPT Education Collaborative FY 23 Quarter Two Report

To ACCEPT Board of Directors,

Per the Collaborative Agreement Governance, the following is the FY 23 Quarterly updates on the programs and services provided by the Collaborative for October - December 2022.

FY 23 began with welcoming staff and 94 students for the Extended School Year Program. Professional Development was offered on August 30th and 31st for all staff with doors open to welcome students on September 1, 2022. Our student enrollment on opening day was 124 students with our end of month number at 128 students (119 placements and 9 extended evaluations). This is an increase of 34 students during this quarter. The minimum target for the number of students is 127 students.

There are currently 13 Home Based Services cases being served by 7 BCBA supervisors and 8 direct therapists. In addition to home services for students and parent training, ACCEPT is conducting 4 functional behavioral assessments within homes.

The Transportation Department provides out of district transportation for 7 member districts. Currently, we transport 186 students across the state of Massachusetts through the efforts of 62 drivers and 18 monitors.

The Professional Development and School Consultation departments have been providing hybrid and virtual PD opportunities for all educators. The Professional Development has met 75% of this year's targeted revenue with many additional PD opportunities to come. School Consultation has extended contracts for services with 10 school districts. The job alike groups have been increased this year to include a DEI and SEL Directors group. ACCEPT is offering a variety of PD opportunities for low incident teaching staff such as music teachers for November 8th PD day. Additionally, our consultants are also working with districts to conduct program evaluations for specialized district programs and student assessments.

With regard to finances, ACCEPT has invoiced \$2,969,436 for services rendered. \$1,818,882 has been received and is accounted for in our year to date profit and loss with an additional \$1,250,554 in accounts receivable. To date ACCEPT has expended \$2,147,075 presenting ACCEPT with a current net profit of \$822,362 at the end of the first quarter.
